## **Chairman's Report**

### **2025 Annual Report**

The year 2025 was another highly successful one for the Association, building on the momentum of our 2024 Centenary celebrations. Several new initiatives and projects were implemented, driving strong growth – particularly in the delivery and expansion of our grassroots programmes.

A record number of entries were received across our regional tournaments, demonstrating the increasing popularity of table tennis in our region. This growth highlights the importance of innovation and adaptability as we seek to provide opportunities for both new participants discovering the sport and our more established players who continue to compete at a high level.

The Association continues to advance its two major facility development projects: the Gillies Avenue redevelopment project and the Lloyd Elmore Community Hub. While progress has been slower than hoped, and at times challenging, our focus remains firm on achieving these long-term goals. We were pleased to secure resource consent for the Lloyd Elmore Community Hub, which has now been elevated to Category A status within the Auckland Facilities Priority Plan. For the Gillies Avenue redevelopment project, we continue to work closely with the Auckland Badminton Association and Olympic Weightlifting Auckland to refine project phasing and total cost planning to ensure financial viability.

A key operational achievement during the year was the upgrade of our Hello Club court booking and access control hardware, along with the realignment of the lighting bays in the Auckland table tennis stadium. This upgrade enabled the introduction of an online booking system, which has been an outstanding success. The system has led to a substantial increase in new casual player registrations and provides players with the convenience of booking tables in advance rather than relying on availability upon arrival. Feedback has been positive, and we have made several refinements to enhance user experience. We gratefully acknowledge the support of Four Winds Foundation, Grassroots Trust, and Table Tennis New Zealand, whose contributions made this project possible.

Maintenance of the Auckland table tennis stadium also remained a priority. The replacement of the roof over the upstairs cafeteria and lounge addressed long-standing leak issues, ensuring durability for years to come. We extend our thanks to the Albert-Eden Local Board, Four Winds Foundation, Pub Charity Limited, and Rano Community Trust for their generous assistance with this essential work.

Grassroots development continues to be a central focus of the Association. Our development coaches – Eberhard Kleiser, Pat Low, and Dinyar Irani – delivered activations and coaching across schools and community venues in Central and East Auckland. A pilot after-school club at Ponsonby Intermediate proved highly successful, providing a model for addressing transport barriers to participation. The Association aims to establish twenty after-school clubs over the next four years. The School Holiday Coaching Programme also continued to attract strong participation.

Our Tables in Communities project remained active, taking table tennis into community spaces. Work continues to consolidate our network of community table sites and ensure each is activated regularly and sustainably. Growth was also observed in the Future Squad and



Junior Club Small Group, both of which serve as key entry pathways into Auckland representative squads.

A major milestone in 2025 was the appointment of Aleksey Yefremov in a full-time role to lead the development and delivery of a comprehensive table tennis coaching programme across the Auckland region, supporting grassroots to elite player development, building coaching capacity, and strengthening community and stakeholder engagement in line with the Association's strategic objectives. Aleksey, who arrived just prior to the 2025 New Zealand Open Table Tennis Championships, brings extensive international experience. His expertise will be instrumental in strengthening the quality and consistency of our coaching and development programmes across all levels – from grassroots through to high performance.

On the performance front, Auckland players once again achieved outstanding results. At the 2025 New Zealand Open, Auckland secured the Under 13, Under 15, and Under 19 Boys' and Girls' Team titles in A Grade, along with the Open Men's Team title. Individual successes were equally impressive, with title wins by Lucas Alexandre (Under 13 Boys), Anson Tse (Under 15 Boys), Hannah Li (Under 19 Girls and Open Women's), and Eli Ho (Open Men's). Remarkably, Eli became the youngest-ever winner of the Open Men's Singles title at 13 years and 202 days – surpassing the previous record held by Auckland's Roger Rao since 2010.

Several Auckland players represented New Zealand on the international stage, including Katie Chen, Elise Chong, Josephine Chong, Oscar Du, Lisa Gear, Elena Harves, Jolene Harves, Eli Ho, Payas Jajal, Oscar Jiang, Jocelyn Lam, Bessie Li, Hannah Li, Jet Lin, Karen Looi, Matome Mongalo, Ayumi Moriyama-Picard, Dean Shu, and Sebastian Ye. Notable achievements included Eli Ho's victory at the 2024 World Hopes Challenge and his double title wins at the 2025 WTT Youth Contender San Francisco II. Eli and Oscar Du were also part of the New Zealand team that won the ITTF-Oceania Under 15 Boys' Team event, qualifying for the 2025 World Youth Championships in Romania. Meanwhile, Lucas Alexandre won the 2025 ITTF-Oceania Hopes Challenge, earning selection for the 2025 World Hopes Tournament in England.

Recipients of the 2025 Commute ATTA Elite Player Scholarships were Lucas Alexandre, Oscar Du, Lisa Gear, Eli Ho, Jocelyn Lam, and Ayumi Moriyama-Picard. The Errol Cheal Memorial Trophy for Auckland Player of the Year was awarded to Eli Ho, while the Auckland Junior Player of the Year awards went to Lucas Alexandre (Boys) and Hannah Li (Girls).

The Association successfully delivered its full calendar of Auckland tournaments. The Auckland table tennis stadium also hosted several major national and international events, including the 2024 ITTF-Oceania Senior Championships, the 2025 TTNZ Hopes Event, three National Training Camps, and a Northern Region Training Camp. We acknowledge ITTF-Oceania and Table Tennis New Zealand for their invaluable partnership and support.

The Association's network of sponsors continues to expand, and we are deeply appreciative of their ongoing generosity. Sponsors for the 2025 season included Butterfly New Zealand, Commute Transportation Consultants, irelax, Jennifer Alexandre, Lexus of Auckland City, Penberthy Insurance, Ray White Real Estate, The Gateau House, and VIPHire. We also received product sponsorship from Anran International (NZ) Limited, Coca-Cola Euro-Pacific Partners, and Rialto Cinemas.

We further acknowledge the crucial financial and operational support provided by our funding partners. My personal thanks go to Shane Warbrooke (Chief Executive Officer), Bob Inns (Treasurer), and Arthur Loo (Honorary Solicitor), who have worked tirelessly to ensure that all documentation and feedback are managed effectively in preparation for compliance with the Incorporated Societies Act 2022 by the 5 April 2026 deadline.

To our colleagues across district associations throughout New Zealand, I extend my best wishes for the year ahead and every success in the coming season.

## **2024-2025 Auckland Interclub competition**

The Auckland Interclub competition continued to provide flexibility for teams to compete with either two or three players on any given night. In two-player teams, each player contested two singles matches and one doubles match. In three-player teams, one player contested two singles matches, while the other two players each competed in one singles and one doubles match. Two-player teams were permitted to compete against three-player teams.

The 2024–2025 Auckland Summer Interclub competition attracted 60 teams, compared with 72 teams in the 2023–2024 season. Teams were placed into ten grades of six teams each, with a full round robin played over five weeks. The top five grades competed on Thursday nights, and the remaining five grades competed on Wednesday nights. A promotion and relegation system operated between all grades. The Summer Interclub format consisted of two “grading” rounds followed by a final “championship” round, providing a total of 15 weeks of play.

The 2025 Auckland Winter Interclub competition attracted 78 teams, compared with 82 teams in the 2023 season. Teams were allocated across thirteen grades of six teams each, contesting a full round robin over five weeks per round. The top five grades competed on Thursday nights, the next five on Wednesday nights, and the lowest three on Tuesday nights. A promotion and relegation system was maintained between all grades. The Winter Interclub competition consisted of three “grading” rounds followed by a “championship” round, totaling 20 weeks of play.

The Interclub Player of the Year Awards were determined by the total number of singles and doubles wins accumulated across the season, irrespective of grade.

The Dick Rassie Memorial Trophy for the 2024–2025 Auckland Summer Interclub Player of the Year was awarded to Matome Mongalo.

The Bill Burns Memorial Trophy for the 2025 Auckland Winter Interclub Player of the Year was awarded to Sihyun Um.

Prizes were also presented to the first-placed teams in each grade following the final round of competition.

All Auckland junior and senior representative players seeking selection for Auckland teams to compete at the 2025 New Zealand Open Table Tennis Championships were required to participate in at least 50% of their team’s contests during the 2025 Auckland Winter Interclub competition.

Funding was received from the Auckland Council Regional Sport & Recreation Fund and NZ Community Trust as a contribution towards the contract fees of David Jackson (Competitions Manager), which included delivery of Tournaments.

## **2025 Auckland Interschools table tennis competition**

College Sport continued to coordinate entries for the Auckland Interschools Table Tennis Competition during Term Two (Winter) and Term Three (Early Spring) in 2025. Entries were submitted through the EnterNow system and subsequently forwarded to the Auckland Table Tennis Association following the close of entries. The Auckland Table Tennis Association was responsible for collecting and processing entries for the Term One (Pre-season) competition.

### **Venues and Sessions**

One venue hosted the single session of the Term One competition:

a) Central Auckland venue: Auckland table tennis stadium; Fridays 3.45p.m. – 6.00p.m.

Two venues hosted three sessions of the Term Two and Term Three competitions:

a) Central Auckland venue: Auckland table tennis stadium; Fridays 3.45p.m. – 6.00p.m. and 6.00p.m. – 8.15p.m.

b) East Auckland venue: St. Kentigern College sports hall, Friday 3.45p.m. – 5.35p.m.

The Friday 3.45 p.m. – 6.00 p.m. session at the Auckland Table Tennis Stadium remained the most popular, with 27 tables utilized in Term Two and 29 in Term Three to accommodate demand. At St Kentigern College, 21 tables were used in Term Two and 16 in Term Three, leaving capacity for further growth.

The later Friday session at the Auckland Table Tennis Stadium (6.00 p.m. – 8.15 p.m.) also had some capacity for expansion, with 22 tables in use during Term Two and 24 during Term Three.

### **Participation**

Team entries for the Auckland Interschools Table Tennis Competition decreased slightly in Terms One and Two compared with the 2024 season. Entry numbers were as follows:

Term One (Pre-season): 27 teams (down from 37 in 2024)

Term Two (Winter): 147 teams (down from 155 in 2024)

Term Three (Early Spring): 130 teams (unchanged from 130 in 2024)

## 2025 Auckland Summer Open

The 2025 Auckland Summer Open attracted 227 participants across a wide range of categories, from Under 11 to Over 60 events. This represented a significant increase from the 184 participants in 2024. The largest event was the D Grade Singles, which drew 67 entries.

## 2025 Auckland Junior Open

25<sup>th</sup> May 2025, Auckland

The 2025 Auckland Junior Open attracted 151 participants across junior categories ranging from Under 9 to Under 19 events, representing a significant increase from the 113 entries received in 2024. The Under 9 age group was introduced for the first time.

To accommodate all age groups, singles events with more than five entrants were played on a knockout basis, with a consolation event held for first-match losers. Knockout matches were contested as the best of five games to 11 points, while consolation matches were played as the best of three games to 11 points.

Entries from female competitors were lower than those from male competitors overall however, there was encouraging participation in the Under 15, Under 13, Under 11, and Under 9 age groups.

In the Under 19 Boys' Singles final, John Wu (Auckland) defeated Eli Ho (Auckland) 3–1, while in the Under 19 Girls' Singles final, Ayumi Moriyama Picard (Auckland) overcame Angel Han (North Shore) 3–1 to claim the title.

The first stage draw was a simple knockout, and all players started in this draw. The gold and silver medals were awarded to the finalists in the simple knockout draw. All players who lost in the simple knockout draw were entered into the second life draw. The winner of the second life draw was placed third and received the bronze medal.

All players who lost in the second life draw, prior to the bronze medal match, played off for final positions in a progressive knockout with other players who lost at the same stage.

Spot prize draws were held on the day.

The event was mixed gender i.e. boys and girls were combined in the same draw and entries were only be accepted from players with 400 or less rating points on the Auckland Table Tennis Association rating list at the entry closing date.

Sixty-four entries were received for the event arising from Auckland, Counties-Manukau, North Shore, and Waitemata.

## 2025 Auckland Open

29<sup>th</sup> (evening), 30<sup>th</sup> – 31<sup>st</sup> August 2025, Auckland

The 2025 Auckland Open was the premier event on the Association's tournament calendar.

A record 274 entries were received, compared with 257 entries in the 2024 season. New Zealand-based participants represented the Auckland, Canterbury, Counties Manukau, Northland, North Shore, Waikato, and Waitemata associations. In addition, eight players from the Oceania Talent Team – representing the Cook Islands, Fiji, Nauru, Papua New Guinea, and Vanuatu – also took part.

Promotion of the event was undertaken through multiple channels, including email, the Association's website, Facebook, Instagram, LinkedIn, printed flyers, and word of mouth. The Open Finals session was held on the evening of Saturday 30<sup>th</sup> August 2025. Free tickets were issued to 397 spectators, who were eligible to enter a series of spot prize draws during the Finals session. This represented an increase from the 359 spectators who attended the 2024 Finals.

An anonymous sponsor contributed \$5,000 towards prize money for the Open Men's Singles and Open Women's Singles events. Lexus of Auckland City sponsored the Open Men's Doubles, and donated four spectator prize packs and one Lexus Weekend Vehicle Voucher drawn during the Finals session. Coca-Cola NZ supplied beverages, including Coca-Cola, Sprite, and Powerade. The Gateau House generously provided cake and gateau for spectators, as well as three \$100 gift vouchers awarded as spot prizes. Complimentary Tip Top ice cream, baked goods, drinks, and confectionery were also distributed to spectators throughout the evening.

More than 1,000 matches were played across the tournament. All events followed a simple knockout format, with consolation draws for players who lost their first match in the main singles events. To manage the large number of matches, several rounds of the A Grade Open Singles and Doubles, and D Grade Open Singles and Doubles, were contested on Friday 29<sup>th</sup> August from 6.00 p.m. Despite these adjustments, the Open Finals session commenced an hour later than scheduled (8.00 p.m.) due to the volume of matches.

The Finals session featured the Open Men's Doubles final, followed by the Open Women's Singles final, and concluded with the Open Men's Singles final. A centre-court atmosphere was created around a single table, with one final played at a time. Dinyar Irani served as Master of Ceremonies for the evening.

## **Errol Cheal Memorial Trophy for Auckland Player of the Year**

In 2007 the family of Errol Cheal donated a trophy to be presented to the Auckland Table Tennis Association Player of the Year. The trophy is presented in memory of Errol Cheal (1907 – 2005).

Errol started playing table tennis as an 11 year old on the kitchen table and kept competing until failing eyesight forced him to stop at the age of 88. Errol was a table tennis player, administrator, coach, and mentor, and achieved a number of milestones throughout his lifetime:

- 1934: First New Zealand Open Men's singles champion
- 1935: Secretary of the Auckland Table Tennis Association
- 1943 – 1959: Chairman of the Auckland Table Tennis Association
- 1949 – 1959: President of the Auckland Table Tennis Association
- 1951 – 1952: President of Table Tennis New Zealand
- 1954: Gold medal for winning the Over 45 Men's singles title at the New Zealand Veteran Table Tennis Championships
- 1970: Served the first ball at the opening of the Auckland table tennis stadium to Sir Dove Meyer Robinson
- 1987: Gold medal for winning the Over 70 Men's singles title at the New Zealand Veteran Table Tennis Championships
- 1990: First New Zealand table tennis player to become a World Champion in winning the Over 80 Men's doubles at the World Veteran Table Tennis Championships in Baltimore, USA. Placed third in the Over 80 Men's singles at the same Championships

Errol was a life member of the Auckland Table Tennis Association and Table Tennis New Zealand, and a member of the International Swaythling Table Tennis Club.

**In 2025 the Errol Cheal Memorial Trophy was awarded to Eli Ho.** Eli achieved a series of outstanding results throughout the 2025 season. He won the World Hopes Challenge in November 2024 and was subsequently awarded an International Table Tennis Federation (ITTF) With The Future In Mind scholarship for 2025. In April, Eli made history by becoming the first New Zealander to win back-to-back titles at a WTT Youth Contender event, claiming both the Under 13 and Under 15 Boys' Singles titles at the 2025 WTT Youth Contender San Francisco II. He went on to win the 2025 North Island Open Men's Singles title in July and placed fifth in the Under 13 Boys' Singles at the European Mini Championships in August. Eli was also a member of the Auckland Open Men's team that won the Kean Shield at the 2025 New Zealand Open Table Tennis Championships in September. He concluded an exceptional season by winning the Open Men's Singles title at the same event, becoming the youngest-ever winner of the title at 13 years and 202 days.

## **Club activities external to the Auckland table tennis stadium**

### **East Auckland Table Tennis Club:**

Development Coach Eberhard Kleiser led the East Auckland Table Tennis Club at the Pakuranga Community Hall every Tuesday evening throughout 2025. The Association supported the club's growth through regular listings in the Eastern Courier on Neighbourly and via connections established through school development coaching. Each session during the season attracted an average of 16 participants, reflecting steady community engagement and interest in the programme.

### **Eastern Table Tennis Club:**

Bob Inns coordinated the Eastern Table Tennis Club, held on Monday evenings at St. Thomas' School Hall from March to November. The club continued to offer free membership to all participants, including students and seniors, encouraging strong community involvement. Promotion was carried out through Neighbourly listings and the Association's school development coaching network. With six tables in operation each night, the club averaged 26 players per session throughout the 2025 season, with one team regularly competing in the Auckland Interclub competition. On several occasions, the club experienced high demand, welcoming up to 35 players on a single night.

Development Coach Eberhard Kleiser also provided free lunchtime coaching at St. Thomas' School on Mondays, attracting an average of 18 students per session during the 2025 season. As part of a reciprocal partnership, St. Thomas' School students received free entry to the Eastern Table Tennis Club, while the club benefited from complimentary hall hire provided by the school.

### **French Bay Table Tennis Club:**

Due to increased hall hire costs, the French Bay Table Tennis Club relocated to a venue outside the Auckland Table Tennis Association's boundary during the 2025 season.

### **Ponsonby Intermediate Table Tennis Club:**

A recent survey of 25 schools and more than 350 students conducted by the Association revealed that 88% of young people expressed an interest in playing table tennis more often. In response, the Association piloted a user-pays after-school club at Ponsonby Intermediate across Terms 1, 2, and 3 of the 2025 season. Led by Eberhard Kleiser with support from Mikram Al-Taiff, the programme proved highly successful, attracting 55 registrations in Term 1, 37 in Term 2, and 25 in Term 3.

Building on this success, the Association established a second after-school club at Remuera Intermediate, scheduled to commence in Term 4, 2025. Looking ahead, the Association aims to establish five new after-school clubs each year from 2026 to 2029, further expanding access to table tennis opportunities for young people across Auckland.

### **Tune Table Tennis Club:**

Dinyar Irani (Tables in Communities Project Manager / Development Coach) continued to lead the Tune Table Tennis Club on Saturday afternoons at the Pakuranga College Gym throughout the 2025 season. The club operated on 41 occasions during the year, an increase from 39 sessions in 2024. A total of 96 players participated in 2025, compared to 108 players in 2024, while the average attendance per player continued to rise, indicating stronger engagement and commitment among regular participants.

The club offered two group coaching sessions each Saturday. The first, the Tune Table Tennis B Squad (2:00 p.m. – 4:00 p.m.), catered to younger children and beginners and was supported by volunteer training partners Arush Gupta and Dennis Xu. The second session, the Tune Table Tennis A Squad (4:00 p.m. – 6:30 p.m.), focused on developing players aspiring to reach competitive club or Auckland representative levels.

With consistent access to the Pakuranga College Gym during the 2025 season, the club benefited from a high-quality facility offering greater space and improved conditions for training. This stability contributed to increased player retention and a continued rise in playing standards, as reflected by the growing number of Tune Table Tennis Club members participating in Auckland Interschools competitions and regional tournaments.

### **Club activities based at the Auckland table tennis stadium**

**Central Club:** The Central Club operated on Monday evenings from 7.00p.m. to 10.00p.m. throughout the 2025 season, facilitated by Eberhard Kleiser. The club utilised a ladder system, with matches played as a single game to 11 points. Players adjusted their rankings by moving their name tags up or down the ladder boards at each table based on match outcomes. The format promoted friendly competition and regular match play. During the 2025 season, the club maintained a strong turnout, averaging 54 players per night.

**Day Club:** The New Zealand Chinese Table Tennis Association (NZCTTA) operated the Day Club on Mondays, Wednesdays, Saturdays, and Sundays from 9.30a.m. to 12.30p.m., running continuously from January to December 2025. In addition to the regular sessions, the NZCTTA organised a Junior Individual Tournament in August 2025 and an Open Team Tournament in September 2025, both well-supported community events.

The Auckland Table Tennis Association and the NZCTTA continued their strong partnership during the 2025 season, with the Association providing stadium keyholder memberships for ten NZCTTA volunteers in recognition of their ongoing contribution to the sport and the facility.

**Korean Club:** Hyo Joo Lee and Jane (Minjeong) Kim coordinated the Korean Club, held on Saturdays from 6.00p.m. to 10.00p.m. throughout the year from January to December 2025. The club was open to all players, offering an inclusive environment that encouraged participation and skill development. Free coaching was provided to attendees by Hyo Joo and Jane, with funding support from the Association, helping to strengthen engagement and grow the local Korean table tennis community.

**Ping Pong Parkinson's:** During the 2025 season, the Association was approached by Mark Young, the New Zealand Ping Pong Parkinson's Coordinator, to explore the establishment of a Ping Pong Parkinson's chapter in Auckland. Judy and Ron Peacock agreed to coordinate the new chapter, which launched with a successful pilot session on Tuesday 20 May 2025, attracting over 20 attendees. Following this, regular sessions were scheduled every Tuesday during the school term, excluding holidays, with Patrick Low volunteering as coach. Over the course of the season, a total of 30 participants took part in the programme.

Notably, Stephen Goodman (Auckland) achieved success at the 2025 Ping Pong Parkinson's New Zealand Nationals, held from 10–11 November and hosted by Table Tennis Nelson, winning the Higher Mobility Men's Singles title.

**University of Auckland Table Tennis Club:** Xiuyuan Zhang served as President of the University of Auckland Table Tennis Club during the 2025 season. The club ran from March to November 2025 on Sunday evenings from 6.30p.m. to 9.30p.m., utilising five tables and catering primarily to University students. From March 2025, the club adopted a new payment structure, charging per table hour rather than a flat seasonal fee, providing greater flexibility for participants.

### **Stadium keyholders & Table hire**

As of 31 August 2025, the Association had 346 financial stadium keyholders, compared with 370 on the same date in 2024. The number of keyholders choosing the weekly payment option through Debit Success increased significantly, marking the first time that weekly payers (193 keyholders) outnumbered those who opted for a lump-sum payment (153 keyholders). Additionally, there were 12 keyholders with paused memberships.

Stadium keyholders were entitled to free access to a range of activities and programs, including Central Club, Day Club, Young Explorers, Day Club U19 training, Girls Coaching, Junior Club, Interclub (excluding team entry fees), Korean Club, and the Huashan Team Competition. Keyholders also received a 15% discount on entry fees for Auckland regional tournaments and were eligible for a draw for a free extension of their stadium keyholder term at the 2025 Auckland Open.

The Management Committee identified that the existing first-come, first-served model for table bookings was inefficient and limited access for both stadium keyholders and casual players. During peak times, players could occupy tables for an unspecified duration, reducing availability for others. This issue was compounded by the growth in keyholder numbers and increased community interest in table tennis.

To improve access and operational efficiency, table hire was removed as a stadium keyholder entitlement from 1 September 2024, introducing a user-pays system for stadium usage. An online booking platform via Hello Club was implemented, allowing keyholders and casual players to book and pay in advance, either online or through an on-site kiosk. Stadium keyholders benefit from discounted table hire rates, with the magnitude of the discount depending on the time of day.

After one year, the new system showed strong results: 501 casual member registrations were recorded as of 31 August 2025, and casual table hire increased by 51% compared with the previous financial year, demonstrating increased access to the Auckland Table Tennis Stadium for the wider community.

Table hire revenue included coach table fees, casual table hire, visitor fees, and venue hire. The stadium hosted a range of organisations, including; Aotearoa Māori Table Tennis Association, Auckland Chinese Table Tennis Association, Bank of China, China Construction Bank, Deloitte, Dementia Auckland, New Zealand Chinese Table Tennis Association, Pathways Health, Synergy Community Trust, and Table Tennis New Zealand.

Venue hire also included major events such as the 2024 ITTF-Oceania Table Tennis Senior Championships, 2025 TTNZ Hopes Event, 2025 NZCTTA Open & Junior Individual Tournaments, three National Training Camps, and the Northern Region Training Camp.

Tables were hired by school groups including Dilworth School, Ficino School, St. Kentigern School, and St. Peter's College.

Registered coaches were charged \$12.50 per hour Monday–Friday and \$25 per hour on weekends. From 1 September 2024, coaches used Hello Club account credit to prepay bookings. A total of fifteen coaches were registered in 2025, although some took periods off for personal reasons. Revenue from coach table fees was 92% of the previous year's revenue.

Stadium keyholders continued to organise independent practice sessions outside of structured clubs and coaching sessions. Strong participation across keyholder activities, development coaching, competitions, events, and casual play continued to place pressure on table availability.

To address this, the Association added extra tables during high-demand periods, including Central Club, Junior Club, Girls' Coaching, and the Auckland Interschools competitions. Despite these measures, the long-term shortage of table tennis courts remains a critical issue requiring strategic attention.

## **Stadium hire**

Meeting room hire contributed to the Association's overall hireage revenue during 2025. The Summit Chess Club rented the upstairs lounge at the Auckland Table Tennis Stadium for club nights on Friday evenings during the school term, while Table Tennis New Zealand utilised the Presidents Lounge for team hui and events.

The Association also partnered with Spacetoco to list and promote available rental spaces, including the Results Centre and the upstairs lounge, enabling multiple individual hires throughout the year and increasing the accessibility and utilisation of the facility.

## **Facilities Development Projects**

a) Facilities Development Project 1: Auckland Council has identified a shortage of indoor court space in the greater Auckland region. In response, the Association continued its partnership with Auckland Badminton Association and Olympic Weightlifting Auckland to explore the redevelopment of the existing Gillies Avenue site.

The project is currently in Phase 1: Investigation & Analysis. Following initial review, the parties agreed not to pursue a fully integrated sport facility, and are instead reassessing redevelopment options to reduce total project costs and enable phased construction. Opportunities for partnerships with third parties are also being explored. The project is revisiting the design brief to reflect the new approach, and conducting a cost/benefit analysis to guide future decisions.

b) Facilities Development Project 2: The Association is a founding member of the Lloyd Elmore Community Hub, a multi-club, multi-code facility at Lloyd Elmore Park. The Hub will serve the four Founding Members: Auckland Table Tennis Association, Howick Gymnastics Club, Pakuranga Bowling Club, and Pakuranga Tennis Club.

LECH has prioritised readiness compared to other Auckland facility projects, with the Hub being a fully consented and costed project. Resource consent has been granted, and the project has been reclassified as Category A under the Tamaki Makaurau Sport & Recreation Facility Plan, indicating that it is ready for construction within the next 3–5 years.

Key milestones achieved include:

- i) Completion of Phase 2: Design & Consent
- ii) Establishment of a Relationship Agreement with Ngāi Tai ki Tāmaki
- iii) Planning of Phase 3: Funding & Construction workstreams

The Association remains committed to both facilities projects, recognising their strategic importance in addressing Auckland's indoor court shortage and providing long-term infrastructure for table tennis and the wider sporting community.

## **Tables in Communities project**

The 2025 season marked the seventh year of the Association's Tables in Communities project, led by Dinyar Irani in his role as Project Manager and Development Coach. The project expanded junior and community engagement by placing table tennis tables in community indoor and outdoor spaces, supporting them with localised programs, and establishing a network of playing communities across Auckland.

Players were connected to public table tennis tables and to other community members through the free Seekapong app, which lists table locations. As of 31 August 2025, the app had 3,828 registered users.

Indoor and outdoor table tennis tables were installed at multiple locations, providing access at all hours. New sites were added and partnerships strengthened with existing ones, resulting in 85 table locations listed on the Seekapong app as of 31 August 2025. By offering tables, bats, and balls free of charge – or at minimal cost – the project removed financial barriers to participation, while the broad geographic distribution of tables reduced transportation barriers. These measures ensure equitable access, enabling participation from all communities, including those in high-deprivation areas.

The Association collaborated with a diverse range of partners to support the project, including community organisations, clubs, marae, recreation centres, schools, libraries, Local Boards, and



Auckland Council, fostering strong community connections and broadening opportunities for table tennis participation.

The goals for the Tables in Communities project are as follows:

- a) 15,000 players registered on the Seekapong app (in progress, 3,828 player registrations)
- b) 100 table tennis tables distributed in the community (achieved, 120 tables distributed)
- c) 40 MOUs signed with Local Boards and facilities (achieved, 86 MOUs signed)

The Association is continuing to trial new strategies to encourage player registration on the Seekapong app, including a revised Seekapong ambassador programme.

Funding was received for Dinyar Irani's (Tables in Communities Project Manager/Development Coach) role from Auckland Council Regional Sport & Recreation Fund, Foundation North, Four Winds Foundation, NZ Community Trust, The Lion Foundation, Tu Manawa Active o Aotearoa, and Whau Local Board.

Funding was received for Tables in Communities project table tennis tables, bats, and balls from Auckland Council Regional Sport & Recreation Fund, Community Organisation Grants Scheme, Foundation North, Pub Charity, Tu Manawa Active o Aotearoa, and Whau Local Board.

During the 2025 season the Association delivered Tables in Communities project activations in public parks, schools, shopping centres, libraries, and other venues in the community. Popular events included the Have a Go Day at Turner's Reserve, Progressive Skills Sessions at Epsom Community Library, activation in Newmarket Station Square, senior citizen session at Panmure Community Library, activation at Pakuranga Plaza, and Seekapong Shootout Tournaments held at Onehunga Community Centre and Ruapotaka Marae.

Throughout the 2025 season, the Association continued to create content and grow its social media following. Social media serves as a key platform for promoting registration on Seekapong and generating interest in table tennis across Auckland, as well as nationally and internationally. As of 31<sup>st</sup> August 2025, the Association had:

- a) Facebook page – 3,601 followers
- b) Instagram – 1,049 followers
- c) WeChat Official page – promotes Association activities and Seekapong
- d) You Tube channel – 401 subscribers

Rialto Cinemas Newmarket continued to support the Tables in Communities project through product sponsorship, which serves as the foundation of an incentives and giveaways program aimed at promoting Seekapong registrations and encouraging greater app usage.

### **Hosting Inclusive Table Tennis (HITT) programme**

The 2025 season marked the 23rd year of the Hosting Inclusive Table Tennis (HITT) programme, run by the Association. This no-cost coaching programme supports special needs players and was held on Tuesday mornings throughout the school year.

During the 2025 season, 147 students from nine schools participated in the programme. Eberhard Kleiser served as Convenor, Coordinator, and Head Coach, supported by over 20 dedicated volunteers who assisted students during coaching sessions.

The programme will culminate in End-of-Year Ribbon Days, scheduled for November 2025, celebrating the achievements and progress of all participants.

### **Drawn Doubles**

The Association hosted a Drawn Doubles evening in conjunction with the 2023–24 Summer Interclub prizegiving and the 2024 Winter Interclub prizegiving. Serving as the Association's end-of-year social function, the event took place on 28 November 2024 and attracted a full complement of 64 entries, highlighting strong community engagement and participation.

The Association plans to continue this tradition with a Drawn Doubles evening in November 2025, held alongside the 2024–25 Summer Interclub prizegiving and the 2025 Winter Interclub prizegiving.

### **Administration, Competitions Manager & Funding Officer**

Hongbing (Peter) Wu continued in the role of Stadium Manager, with funding support provided by Blue Sky Community Trust, Foundation North, and Milestone Foundation.

Ying Ma continued to provide administrative support to the Association on Saturdays and Sundays, ensuring smooth day-to-day operations.

David Jackson maintained his role as Competitions Manager, overseeing the organisation and delivery of tournaments and Interclub competitions, with funding support from the NZ Community Trust.

Cliff Freeman continued to be contracted to provide funding services, supporting the Association's financial management and grant processes.

### **Stadium maintenance**

The Auckland Table Tennis Stadium continued to benefit from strong support for maintenance and facility upgrades during the 2025 season. Auckland Council maintained the Pascoe Quarry Reserve grounds and carpark, while Virginia Waters managed the gardening and landscaping in the garden area in front of the stadium.

Volunteers Nick Ning and Michael Wang provided invaluable assistance with general stadium maintenance, including repairing barriers, replacing broken floorboards, completing minor building and plumbing tasks, and addressing other facility needs, helping ensure the stadium remained in excellent condition.

Funding from Blue Sky Community Trust enabled the replacement of five Butterfly Centrefold Rollaway table tennis tables on the stadium floor, enhancing playing quality for all users.

The Association continued to contract Safety Online for Health & Safety Management Software, meeting regulatory requirements by logging meeting minutes, site checks, accident reports, and staff training.

Ongoing investment in Hello Club hardware and software supported stadium member management and access control. During the year, an additional light bay was installed and lighting realigned in December 2024, and the hardware was upgraded in April 2025. Funding for these improvements was received from the Four Winds Foundation, Grassroots Trust, and Table Tennis New Zealand.

Top Caliber Cleaning provided daily cleaning services, supported by funding from Blue Sky Community Trust and Milestone Foundation.

Major infrastructure work included the removal and replacement of the roof over the upstairs lounge and cafeteria, funded by Albert-Eden Local Board, Four Winds Foundation, Pub Charity, and Rano Community Trust. The stadium was closed until 5.00p.m. on both 21 July 2025 and 4 August 2025 to allow the roof to be removed in sections. Roof replacement took place while the stadium remained operational.

Additional funding was received from the Dragon Community Trust and Maungakiekie-Tamaki Local Board to support Table Tennis New Zealand affiliation fees, and from the Maungakiekie-Tamaki Local Board for stadium insurance.

## **Sponsorship**

Commute Transportation Consultants continued their support of the Commute ATTA Elite Player Scholarships during the 2025 season, marking the seventh year of their sponsorship. The scholarships assist elite players with costs associated with attending international table tennis events. ## **Coaching, Squads and Development division**

### **Player Development Pathway**

The Association's Player Development Pathway is designed to guide athletes from their first introduction to table tennis through to Auckland representative level, including:

a) Community Engagement and School Programmes

- through community events, demonstrations, promotions, school coaching programmes, and after-school clubs, new participants are introduced to table tennis – often for the first time – helping to grow awareness and participation across Auckland

b) Foundational Clubs and Training Sessions

- programmes such as Young Explorers, Junior Club, Day Club U19 Training, Girls' Coaching, and School Holiday Coaching provide players with an introduction to the sport and the opportunity to develop fundamental table tennis skills in a fun and inclusive setting

c i) Future Squad

- a development squad for players under 9 years old, offering their first experience of structured, high-quality coaching. The programme focuses on skill development and long-term growth, with the goal of preparing future Auckland representative players. Players may remain in the Future Squad until they are no longer eligible for the Under 11 age category

c ii) Junior Club Small Group

- this group builds upon foundational skills and provides a bridge between introductory programmes and representative-level training, preparing players for the next step in their development

d) Auckland Intermediate B Squad

- a junior development squad for identified players, providing high-quality training and coaching to prepare them for future selection as Auckland representatives

e) Auckland Intermediate A Squad

- an advanced junior development squad offering regular, intensive training with a focus on performance improvement and readiness for representative competition

f) Auckland Elite Squad

- a high-performance training environment for Auckland's top junior and senior players, providing comprehensive coaching and development opportunities for those competing at both national and international levels

## **Junior Coaching delivered at the Auckland table tennis stadium**

**Young Explorers:** conducted by Teng Teng Liu on Monday afternoons (3.45p.m. – 4.45p.m.) during the school term, the Young Explorers programme focused on developing coordination and basic racquet skills in children aged 4 to 8. The sessions provided a fun and engaging introduction to table tennis, with an average attendance of three participants per session

**Day Club Under 19 training:** led by Yumin Lin and Haikun Wang, this training was held on Saturday afternoons (12.30p.m. – 2.00p.m.) and managed by the New Zealand Chinese Table Tennis Association, who also oversaw fee collection. The programme introduced students to table tennis and helped them develop fundamental playing skills, averaging 18 participants per session

**Junior Club:** delivered by Eberhard Kleiser and Josh Alexandre on Thursday evenings (5.00p.m. – 6.30p.m.), the Junior Club introduced players to table tennis and developed their core technical skills. Running alongside the Girls' Coaching programme, it also offered a pathway for girls to transition to mixed-group training when ready. The programme maintained strong participation, averaging 42 players per session

To support player progression, Junior Club Qualification Tournaments were held in February, May, July, and October 2025, determining promotion to the Junior Club Small Group for one Under 13 boy and girl, and one Under 15 boy and girl per qualification

**Junior Club Small Group:** conducted by Dinyar Irani on Thursday evenings (5.00p.m. – 6.30p.m.), this programme provided advanced foundational training for players preparing to enter Auckland's representative development squads. In February, May, and July 2025, the Association organised play-off matches between Junior Club Small Group qualifiers (Under 13 boy and girl) and top-ranked Future Squad players to determine promotion to the Auckland Intermediate B2 Squad

For the same periods, Junior Club Small Group qualifiers in the Under 15 age category were granted direct promotion to the Intermediate B2 Squad due to available spaces

**Girls' Coaching:** Held on Thursday evenings (5.00p.m. - 6.30p.m.) and led by Teng Teng Liu and Haikun Wang, the Girls' Coaching programme provided a supportive environment for girls to develop fundamental skills and build confidence in the sport. Upon achieving sufficient skill progression, participants transitioned into the Junior Club mixed training group. Each session averaged 11 participants throughout the 2025 season

## **Future Squad**

The Future Squad programme was led by Tony Chang and Haikun Wang, with training sessions held three times per week:

Wednesdays 5.30p.m. – 7.00p.m.

Saturdays 3.00p.m. – 4.30p.m.

Sundays 3.00p.m. – 4.30p.m.

Throughout the year, players were invited to trial for the Future Squad, with successful candidates offered a place in the programme. By the end of the 2024 / 2025 financial year, there were 16 players enrolled.

To support player progression, the Association held three qualification tournaments during the year – in February, May, and July 2025. Each event began with a round-robin competition among Future Squad members, followed by a second-stage round robin between the top-ranked boy and girl from the Future Squad and the top-ranked Under 13 boy and girl from the Junior Club Small Group. These matches determined promotion to the Auckland Intermediate B2 Squad.

The Association also continued its commitment to developing coaching talent by engaging local players as training partners for the Future Squad. During the year, Authman Al-Saudi, Jayden Cheung, Jocelyn Lam, Chi-An Liu, Yilin Lu, Andy Wu, Honggang Zhang, and Allen Zhu contributed in this role, providing valuable support and gaining experience in a coaching environment.

### **Auckland representative squads**

The Auckland representative squad coaching programme encompassed the Auckland Elite Squad, Auckland Intermediate A Squad, and Auckland Intermediate B Squad, led by Wei Zhong Jiang, Josh Alexandre, Dinyar Irani, and Haikun Wang. These programmes provided a structured pathway for developing and supporting Auckland's most talented junior and senior players.

The Auckland Intermediate A Squad and Auckland Intermediate B Squad trained three times weekly as follows:

Mondays 5.00p.m. – 7.00p.m.

Tuesdays 5.00p.m. – 7.00p.m.

Sundays 12.45p.m. – 2.45p.m.

The Auckland Elite Squad trained two times weekly as follows:

Tuesdays 7.00p.m. – 9.00p.m.

Sundays: 3.00p.m. – 6.00p.m.

To ensure players trained regularly with others of similar ability, the squads were further divided into Elite 1, Elite 2, Intermediate A1, Intermediate A2, Intermediate B1, and Intermediate B2. This structure improved the quality of training sessions and the efficiency of qualification tournaments.

Three qualification tournaments were conducted across the 2025 season — in February, May, and July. Each tournament consisted of an internal round robin within each squad, followed by a second-stage round robin where top-ranked players competed against the lowest-ranked players from the next-highest squad to determine promotion and relegation.

When vacancies existed in a squad, top-ranked players from the next-lower squad were promoted directly. Results from the July 2025 qualification tournaments also informed the selection of Auckland representative teams for the 2025 New Zealand Open Table Tennis Championships.

The Association maintained clear selection criteria for players eligible to represent Auckland at the 2025 New Zealand Open Table Tennis Championships. These applied to the Open Men's A and B Teams, Open Women's A Team, and all junior representative teams. To be eligible, players were required to:

- attend at least 50% of squad training sessions
- enter the Auckland Summer Open, ANZAC Open, Auckland Junior Open (for players under 18 years), and Auckland Open, unless a valid excuse was provided
- enter a team in Auckland Winter Interclub and compete in at least 50% of fixtures, unless a valid excuse was provided

By the end of the 2024 / 2025 financial year, enrolments were as follows:

- Auckland Elite Squad: 16 players
- Auckland Intermediate A Squad: 16 players
- Auckland Intermediate B Squad: 15 players

All players aged over 18 years were exempt from squad coaching fees.

The Association continued to foster the development of future coaching talent by offering opportunities for emerging players to assist as training partners within the Auckland Intermediate Squad. During the year, Lucas Alexandre, Josephine Chong, Rayan Engineer, Tushan Engineer, Eli Ho, Oscar Jiang, Joshua Lu, Ayumi Moriyama-Picard, Ruofei Rao, Toby Xu, Ethan Yin, and Jacob Yuan supported training sessions in this capacity, contributing to both player and coaching development across the programme.

### **Coaching Team Expansion**

The Association welcomed Aleksey Yefremov to the Coaching Team in September 2025. Aleksey brings with him nearly 30 years of international coaching experience, having worked with national teams, elite athletes, and grassroots players around the world. His appointment represents a significant step forward in strengthening Auckland's coaching and player development pathways.

Aleksey's dual focus includes:

- a) Player Development – assisting athletes of all levels to improve their performance and achieve their potential
- b) Coach Education – supporting and upskilling coaches to enhance the overall standard of coaching within the Auckland table tennis community

His expertise and leadership will create new opportunities for players and coaches to learn, grow, and excel.

### **Development Coaching**

Eberhard Kleiser was employed by the Association as a Development Coach, contributing significantly to the growth and promotion of table tennis across Auckland. His role encompassed a wide range of responsibilities supporting both community engagement and player development initiatives.

Key areas of responsibility included:

- a) delivering school development programmes and community promotions across Central and East Auckland. Between September 2024 and August 2025, Eberhard conducted 103 development sessions, introducing table tennis to approximately 4,839 students
- b) providing development coaching at the Auckland table tennis stadium, contributing to the Association's Player Development Pathway through involvement in the Junior Club and School Holiday Coaching programmes
- c) serving as Club Coordinator for both the Central Club and East Auckland Table Tennis Club, supporting local participation and club operations
- d) coordinating and delivering the HITT Special Needs Programme — an award-winning initiative endorsed by Special Olympics New Zealand, offering inclusive table tennis experiences for students from special needs units
- e) promoting and managing the Auckland Primary & Intermediate Interschools table tennis team competition, held across Central and East Auckland during Terms 2 and 3 of the 2025 season
- f) assisting with the promotion and delivery of the Auckland Interschools Table Tennis Competition in Central and East Auckland during Terms 1, 2, and 3 of the 2025 season
- g) supporting and promoting Auckland regional tournaments, including assistance with the 2024 Primary School Tournament (November), 2025 Central Zone Intermediate School Tournament, and 2025 South-Eastern Zone School Tournament
- h) delivering community activations as part of the Tables in Communities project at the Auckland table tennis stadium and a range of community venues, helping to bring the sport to new audiences

Eberhard's dedication and outreach efforts played a vital role in strengthening community engagement and fostering participation in table tennis across Auckland.

Eberhard Kleiser encouraged students who participated in the Association's development coaching sessions to extend their involvement by entering the 2025 Central Auckland Primary & Intermediate Table Tennis Team Competition, held during Terms 2 and 3, providing them with valuable match experience in a fun and competitive environment.

Dinyar Irani delivered regular development coaching throughout the 2025 season at Pakuranga College, helping students build foundational skills and develop a sustained interest in table tennis.

Yumin Lin provided ongoing in-school coaching for students at ACG Parnell College and Epsom Girls' Grammar School, ensuring consistent skill development and engagement throughout the season.

Patrick Low played an integral role in the Association's East Auckland development programmes. In Term 4 of the 2024 season, he led the ATTA Intermediate East Auckland Development Squad, and throughout 2025, he delivered coaching and development sessions at Bucklands Beach Intermediate, Farm Cove Intermediate, Somerville Intermediate, and St. Kentigern Boys' School. Patrick also operated after-school clubs at Farm Cove Intermediate (Thursdays) and Somerville Intermediate (Fridays) during the school term.

Students in East Auckland had further opportunities to progress their table tennis journey by participating in the 2025 East Auckland Primary & Intermediate Table Tennis Team Competition during Terms 2 and 3, coordinated by Patrick Low.

## School Holiday Coaching division

The School Holiday Coaching programmes were scheduled for one week (Monday to Friday) during each school holiday period, operating from 9.00 a.m. to 4.00 p.m. daily. Programmes were successfully delivered in October 2024, January 2025, April 2025, and July 2025.

Promotion of the programmes was undertaken by Dinyar Irani, Eberhard Kleiser, and Patrick Low, who engaged directly with students during school demonstrations, promotional visits, and development coaching sessions. The Association also maintained a School Holiday Coaching programme contact list and promoted directly to past participants.

Each programme was delivered by a team of five coaches, depending on availability. Coaches included Tony Chang, Dinyar Irani, Jane Kim, Eberhard Kleiser, Yanlin Li, Teng Teng Liu, Kai Peng, and Jonathan Wong.

The programme catered to students aged 8 to 16 years and was designed to develop fundamental table tennis skills. Participants could register for a single day, multiple days, or the full week. For health and safety reasons, attendance was limited to 75 students per day, with five coaches contracted to ensure quality delivery. A total of 30 tables were set up on the stadium playing floor to accommodate participants.

### Participation Numbers

The number of students who attended each School Holiday Coaching was as follows:

October 2024 – 100 students (from 89 students in 2023)

January 2025 – 79 students (from 79 students in 2024)

April 2025 – 99 students (from 87 students in 2024)

July 2025 – 93 students (from 89 students in 2024)



# Statement of Service Performance

### Description of Medium to Long Term Objectives

Auckland Table Tennis Association (Inc) facilitates participation in table tennis in the Central and Eastern Auckland geographic region, and fosters the growth of the sport in Auckland and, ultimately, nationally.

### Description and Quantification of the Entity's Outputs

The Association expanded Auckland Squad Training. Future Squad training sessions were moved to different days and times to allow for continued growth. Auckland Intermediate Squad expanded to four groups (A1, A2, B1, B2). Auckland Elite Squad numbers remained steady. Auckland Squad Training activities were subsidised by the Association.

The Association delivered development coaching in schools, demonstrations, Young Explorers, Junior Club, Day Club U19 training, and Girls' Coaching. School Holiday Coaching ran in October 2024, January 2025, April 2025, and July 2025. The School Holiday Coaching programme in April 2025 only ran for four days, instead of the usual five days, due to Easter Monday.

Hireage was comprised of coach table fees, casual table hire, school table hire, corporate table hire, visitor fees, venue hire, and meeting room hire. Venue hire included the 2024 ITTF-Oceania Senior Championships, 2025 TTNZ Hopes Event, 2025 NZCTTA Open & Junior Individual Tournaments, National Training Camps (x3), and Northern Region Training Camp. The Association did not host the North Island Team Championships during the 2025 financial year. Regular hirers of meeting room space included Table Tennis New Zealand and Summit Chess Club.

The Auckland Interschools table tennis competition catered for 27 teams from 3 schools during Term 1 of the 2025 season (compared with 37 teams from 3 schools in 2024), 147 teams from 29 schools during Term 2 of the 2025 season (compared with 155 teams from 25 schools in 2024), and 130 teams from 23 schools during Term 3 of the 2025 season (compared with 130 teams from 21 schools in 2024).

The Auckland Primary & Intermediate table tennis team competition catered for 45 teams from 17 schools during Term 2 of the 2025 season (compared with 46 teams from 17 schools in 2024), and 44 teams from 20 schools during Term 3 of the 2025 season (compared with 44 teams from 18 schools in 2024).

The Association had 346 financial stadium keyholders at 31st August 2025, a decrease of 24 financial stadium keyholders compared with the previous financial year.

The Association delivered six regional tournaments, one Interschools tournament, two Intermediate Zone tournaments, and one Primary School tournament during the financial year ended 31st August 2025. Tournaments proved popular with record entries

received for the 2024 Primary School Tournament, 2024 Auckland Spring Open, 2025 Auckland Summer Open, 2025 ANZAC Day Open, 2025 Auckland Junior Open, and 2025 Auckland Open.

Central Club revenue remained constant compared with the 2024 season. Pakuranga Club revenue increased by 17% compared with the 2024 season due to increased participation. Korean Club revenue increased by 84% compared with the 2024 season due to increased participation. The method of charging University of Auckland Table Tennis Club changed from January 2025 moving to a charge per table hour used instead of a flat fee per season, which led to an increase in revenue. Ping Pong Parkinson's was established in May 2025, and ran on a weekly basis during the school term. A user pays after-school club was established at Ponsonby Intermediate in January 2025 and ran in Term 1, Term 2, and Term 3.

The 2024-2025 Summer Interclub competition catered for 60 teams (compared with 72 teams in 2023-2024). The 2025 Winter Interclub competition catered for 78 teams (compared with 84 teams in 2024).

### **Additional Output Measures**

The Tables in Communities project is expanding junior and community participation by placing table tennis tables in indoor and outdoor community spaces, delivering localised programmes to support their use, and creating a growing network of playing communities across Auckland. The free Seekapong app connects players with tables in public spaces and with others who share a passion for the sport. As of 31 August 2025, the app had 3,828 registered users and 86 table sites listed.

### **Additional Information**

Table hire was removed as a stadium keyholder entitlement from 1st September 2024.

### Basis of Preparation

The entity is permitted by law to apply the Tier 3 (NFP) Standard issued by the External Reporting Board (XRB) and has elected to do so. A PBE may apply the standard if it does not have public accountability and has total annual expenses less than or equal to \$5,000,000. All transactions in the Performance Report are reported using the accrual basis of accounting. The Performance Report is prepared under the assumption that the entity will continue to operate in the foreseeable future.

### Goods and Services Tax (GST)

The entity is registered for GST. All amounts are stated exclusive of goods and services tax (GST) except for accounts payable and accounts receivable which are stated inclusive of GST.

### Income Tax

Auckland Table Tennis Association Inc is wholly exempt from New Zealand income tax having fully complied with all statutory conditions for these exemptions.

### Bank Accounts and Cash

Bank accounts and cash in the Statement of Cash Flows comprise cash balances and bank balances (including short term deposits) with original maturities of 90 days or less.

### Changes in Accounting Policies

There have been no changes in accounting policies. Policies have been applied on a consistent basis with those of the previous reporting period.

### Solvency Reserve

The Auckland Table Tennis Association shall endeavour to maintain a solvency reserve of cash equivalent balances at least equal to 9 months of Expenses as detailed in the audited accounts of the Association as at the previous balance date


